

## **Russian, Central, and Eastern European Studies Concentration**

### **RES 291: Perspectives in Twentieth-Century Central and East European Literature** (Todd Armstrong)

This course will consider a number of major works from the countries of Central and Eastern Europe (Poland, former-Czechoslovakia, former-Yugoslavia). In addition to reading and discussing a number of literary texts, students will be required to write three papers in the course: two assignments (4-5 pages); and one final essay (6-7 pages). Each paper will emphasize close reading skills and careful literary analysis. Students also submit informal writing on blackboard on a regular basis.
