Community Standards vs. Actions That Violate Our Self-Governing Community

You will note that previously specified behaviors (listed under the “old system”) have been clustered into broader themes/community standards (listed under the “current system”). When completing the *Statement of Complaint & Request for Hearing* form, please use the following chart when determining the appropriate standard(s) to list in the “alleged college policy violation(s)” portion of the form.

For example, if a student is alleged to have engaged in disorderly or disruptive behavior, furnished false information to a Campus Safety & Security officer, did not comply with the Security officer’s directions, and destroyed College property...you would list:

Standard 1: Integrity – disorderly/disruptive conduct; Standard 1: Integrity – intentionally furnishing false information; Standard 2: Personal Safety – failure to comply with the directions of College officials; Standard 3: Respect – destroying/damaging personal or College property

<p><i>Standard 1:</i> Grinnellians act with integrity and consider how their actions will impact others.</p>
<p><i>Standard 2:</i> Grinnellians value the personal safety of themselves and other members of the Grinnell community.</p>
<p><i>Standard 3:</i> Grinnellians respect personal and College property and role model good citizenship by abiding by local, state, and federal laws and accept the consequences for not adhering to them.</p>
