Identification of rooms in Science Phase 2 that could be used by non-science faculty

Science post Phase 2 (available about 2006) approximately 17 classrooms suitable for non-science use Some of these for computer lab classes like statistics and some are traditional lecture halls. These are listed with unscheduled times (taken from a hypothetical Fall classroom schedule drawn up by the Science departments).

- 2 lecture halls seating 56 and 48 (available 6 time slots out of 22* for the two rooms)
- 2 computer-equipped statistical classrooms of 36 and 32 seats (available 16 time slots out of 22 for the two rooms)
- 3 math classrooms of 32 seats each (available 6 slots out of a total of 33)
- 2 medium-sized classrooms of 45 and 30 seats respectively (available 7 slots out of 22)
- 2 small classroom of 21 and 24 seats, respectively (available 15 time slots out of 22)
- 2 Bio workshops possibly available when Bi 01c is not used (available, it seems, 18 slots out of 22)
- 4 seminar rooms of 18 seats each (available 20 slots out of 33)

*Assuming there are a total of 11 times slots in a week
