CHARGES

- **Tuition:** Tuition will be charged on a per term basis. Tuition charges will be pro-rated for student approved to attend Grinnell part time.
- Student Activity Fee: The activity fee will be charged on a per-term basis to those students who are living on campus during that term and any off-campus students who have been invited to take on-campus classes during that term.
- Room & Board: Room & Board will be charged to students living in the Residence Halls for the terms of occupancy. All students living on campus are required to participate in the dining plan.
- **Damage Deposit**: All new Grinnell students are required to pay a \$100 damage deposit that is included as a charge on the first billing statement. Upon graduation or withdrawal from the College, the unused deposit will be credited to the student account.

ACCESSING YOUR BILL

- A paper copy of the first statement of the term is mailed to the address provided by the student. Paper statements are not mailed internationally.
 Statements were mailed yesterday.
- Students can access printable online statements, make payments, add authorized users and set up payment plans through GrinnellShare.





- Monthly Payment Plans




- Students and their authorized users can make online U.S. bank payments 24 hours a day through their online billing account. Accepted online payment methods:

CREATING AN AUTHORIZED USER



• The authorized person will receive two separate emails with instructions on how to log in to their account. <u>Authorized users will receive their own login links</u>.



MONTHLY TUITION PAYMENT PLAN

grinnell.edu/payment-plan

- A payment plan is a convenient, manageable payment solution that provides the option to pay tuition in interest-free monthly installments, rather than one lump sum.
- The Grinnell Real-Time Payment Plan, administered by TouchNet, matches the student account current term balance in real time. The enrollment fee is \$17.50 per term.
- Each installment is due the 25th of the month.
 - Fall 1: July, August
 - Fall 2: September, October, November
 - Spring 1: December, January, February
 - Spring 2: March, April, May

STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE

- Grinnell College requires all students to have Affordable Care Act compliant health insurance.
- In accordance with this requirement, all students are billed \$1,841 for the Student Health Insurance Plan.
- Students must enroll in or waive out of the college insurance plan no later than August 14th, 2020 or upon their first term of enrollment (for those on leave).
- The coverage for the Student Health Insurance Plan is from Aug. 14, 2020 to Aug. 13, 2021.

CONDITIONS FOR WAVING COLLEGE PROVIDED INSURANCE CONVERGE

- Enrollment in a private health insurance plan that is based in the United States and Affordable Care Act Compliant.
- Students residing outside the U.S. will be able to waive the insurance until they
 enter the U.S. and do not have ACA compliant health insurance.
 - Students must purchase a pro-rated plan beginning from their entry into the U.S. through the end of the plan year (August 13, 2021) if they do not have ACA compliant health insurance.
- Students with out-of-state Medicaid will be able to waive the insurance if they are living in their home state.
 - Upon approved return to lowa the college will provide financial aid to cover the cost of the required student health plan.

REFUNDS

- The refund policy remains consistent with prior years, altered for the updated term length
- A student withdrawing from the College within the first three weeks of the term is held responsible for tuition, room, board (meal plan), and other fees on a prorated basis as of the date the student withdraws. If a student withdraws after three weeks into the term, no tuition, room, meal plan, and other fees will be refunded. The same policy applies to emergency leaves. Tuition, room, board, and other fees will not be refunded for students suspended or dismissed for academic or conduct reasons during the semester.
